



Is your primary residence in the District?








Do you have children attending a school in the District?








How do you like to receive school/District information?







Support for Student Services

Last year, the District held community conversations that reinforced the importance of providing mental health services and better preparing our students for college, careers, and jobs in our area. Therefore, these items became high priorities in our strategic plan.

Next year, the \$730,000 referendum used to pay for these student services will expire. The District is asking voters to consider renewing the referendum for \$960,000 because staff expenses and student needs have increased. Without approval, the positions will be eliminated in fall 2025.

The funds will pay for staff positions to help students:


- Access resources for crisis intervention and suicide prevention.
- Receive help to deal with mental health challenges.
- Explore careers, set goals, and solve problems.
- Reach graduation, develop post-graduation plans, and improve attendance.

If approved, this referendum would run through the 2027-28 school year, which aligns with the expiration of the 2023 referendum. Because this is a renewal, approval of the \$960,000 referendum would increase the tax mill rate by approximately \$.09 per \$1,000, representing an annual tax increase of \$9 for every \$100,000 of property value.






Would you support a \$960,000 referendum to fund existing student support staff positions for the next three years? (*Staff Residents*)








Would you support a \$960,000 referendum to fund existing student support staff positions for the next three years? (*Parent Residents*)







Would you support a \$960,000 referendum to fund existing student support staff positions for the next three years? (Non-Parent/Non-Staff Residents)








Additional Analysis: Would the \$960,000 referendum to pay for student support staff positions be supported?



Background Information

The District's tax mill rate (which is used to calculate a district's share of local property taxes) has been declining. Some Ashwaubenon property owners saw an increase in their taxes last year as a result of property value reassessment. The school district has no role in determining property assessments.

Due to changes in the state budget, our tax mill rate for 2023-24 is \$6.95. Since 2016-17, the property tax mill rate has **dropped by more than 28 percent**.
